Discussed logistics of class sites

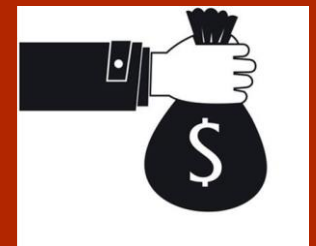
Decided a 2-hour session meeting twice a week on site was optimal

students

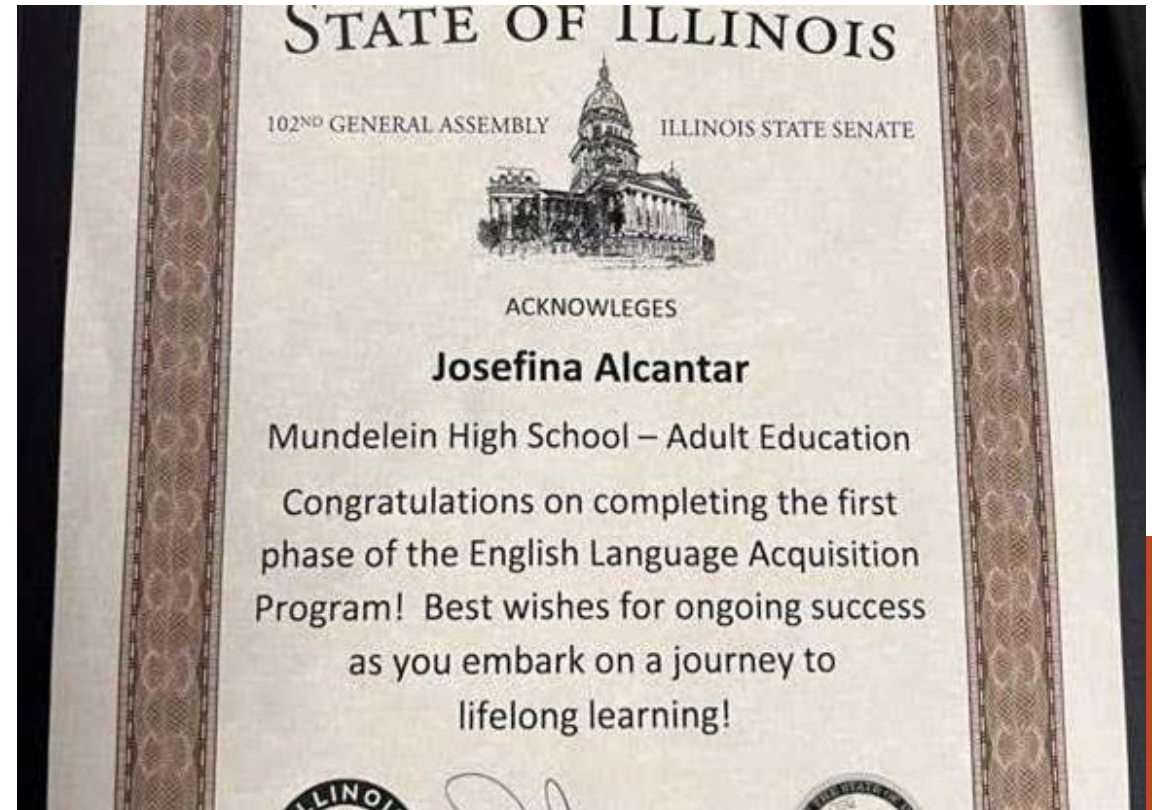
- 2 of 14 students increased their overall scale score
